Inaugural meeting of the Regional Pathfinder Group on Automatic Recognition

19-20 June 2013

Preamble on the synergy of two initiatives

The countries (EE,DK, SE, BE, DE, PT, NL, LU, and SI) and regions (Nordic-Baltic, Benelux and WB) with the auspices and coordination of European Commission, agreed to set up a pathfinder group for setting up a fast track to recognising each other's qualifications; ultimately, paving the way for a European area of recognition, to realise the long term goal of Automatic Recognition (AR) of comparable academic degrees, as formulated in the Bucharest Communiqué.

A number of HEAs and HEIs from the region (Albania, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia and Slovenia), in the presence of Higher Education Authority of Ireland and Swedish National Agency for Higher Education, under the auspices of the Regional Cooperation council, in September 2012 in Dubrovnik, agreed to establish the Regional Platform for Benchmarking and Cooperation aiming to encourage strategic debate in the WB region on higher education issues which will impact on its development, foster a regional 'collective voice' in higher education that resonates regionally, nationally and internationally and support the identification of collaborative solutions in higher education.

These two initiatives have met in the joint effort to provide a platform for constructive





dialogue on the establishment of the emerging Region of Automatic Recognition (RAR) and to discuss necessary measures to be taken, to uphold genuine quality and ensure trust within RAR. As first step towards this goal, the EC Pathfinder Group and the Regional Platform for Cooperation and Benchmarking will establish Regional Pathfinder Group to act as a subgroup of the EC Pathfinder Group.
